

Catherine Taormina's film Twelfth Night, is now available as a digital download right to your computer. Filmed at various locations throughout the tri-state area, Shakespeare's entire play - with no cuts to the text - features a cast of 19 actors in handmade costumes that suggest the period.

Catherine Taormina's spirited Shakespearian comedy, *Twelfth Night*, is now available as a digital download from the filmmaker's official website <u>www.12thNight.info</u>

This contemporary yet traditional rendition of Shakespeare's **Twelfth Night** offers a *breath of fresh air* to those looking to understand Shakespeare without the typical thick, heavily accented speech and without stretching far from what one would assume was Shakespeare's intent. The film follows a story of mistaken identity and gender bending while *messages of love* and refusals run rampant throughout, mirrored by *challenges* of duels and manhood besetting both man and woman.

Producer, Director and Actress **Catherine Taormina** filmed on location at the Lady's Pavilion in **Central Park** a cobblestone street in downtown NYC, a beautiful Victorian private mansion in **Asbury Park**, **NJ** a bungalow in **Highland Lakes**, **NJ**, a small house in **Long Branch**, **NJ**, a farm with a body of water in **Seaville**, **NJ**, and lastly, the sprawling, lush, gorgeous and versatile estate grounds of **Waveny Park** in **New Canaan**, **CT**.

Taormina and her actor-producer-husband **Nick Addeo** who plays **Sir Andrew Aguecheek** in the film, provided the shoe-string out-of-pocket budget. Taormina also acted in (she plays **Viola**), cast, production designed, costumed, propped, lit, filmed and edited the project.

After a 2 month rehearsal period, **Twelfth Night** was filmed in 11 days over a period of 1¹/₂ months. Using minimal equipment throughout, Taormina used her artistic eye, her personal photography and videography experiences, her fine and abstract art abilities and general observations from movie and TV watching for set dressing and for framing composition.

Taormina taught the actor playing **Feste** melodies she composed for Shakespeare's songs sprinkled throughout the play, on a renaissance-type sounding instrument called the **Strumstick** generously donated by the manufacturers! The dress worn by the character Maria was also sponsored by **Artemisia Designs**.

Catherine Taormina's Twelfth Night echoes a masterpiece theater type style. Capturing some stunning footage, humorous moments, some great acting performances and engaging directorial choices while honoring the work of **William Shakespeare**.

Originally from West Long Branch, NJ and a Magna Cum Laude graduate of Monmouth University, Catherine Taormina is a 17+ year NYC creative working within many areas of the arts. Catherine Taormina is fun, energetic & very upbeat. She is a member of SAG-AFTRA and AEA. Working on stage and in film & video as a performer, she may be seen playing Olympia Dukakis' character as a younger woman (Paul Reiser's mother and Peter Falk's wife) in a flashback scene in the movie "The Thing About My Folks". She has also appeared in various short films, industrials, spec commercials and off-off broadway shows. Catherine has an extensive behind the scenes film and theater resume, most recently in costume and sound departments enjoying directing, camera work and video editing the most. Taormina also performers as a singer-songwriter-guitarist-pop-rock funk-punker using the name Rockstar Sissy. She is the composer of 23 fun, danceable, groovin', catchy songs and performs solo or with a band - most recently her with her husband Nick Addeo on bass. She is a 4 year Hodgkin's Lymphoma Survivor and composed the song "I'm Too Young For This" for the organization Stupid Cancer/I2Y. She is also a published author with a book of poetry entitled "Chalkboard With A Bad Eraser" and also has a handmade book entitled "My Steaks Are Rare Put Up Your Dukes You Ain't In The Ring With No Porkchop". Taormina is an environmental steward and a conscious consumer. Buying green electricity for more than 15 years and composting are some of her favorite contributions as well as repurposing tchotchke and colorful remnants into dazzling artwork - look out for her highness and her artwork featured in the upcoming work of renown fine art photographer Illona Swarc. When she is not busy organizing, doing, creating artwork, or working in the fabric arts, Taormina goes for a 4 mile run in Central Park, jump ropes, and goes from one assignment to the next by bicycle and more recently citibike! Taormina is a professional massage therapist (www.taomassage.com) and therapeutic movement facilitator who also enjoys following recipes in the kitchen, often surprising herself! These summer months you will find her in second year of her successful vegetable garden, many of which vegetables she will press into fresh juices and make into dehydrated snacks returning the food scraps to her compost.
